


When Disasters Strike -Will You and Your Cat Be Ready?



Hurricane season officially starts today although there have already been two tropical depressions that have formed off South Carolina and brought lots of rain, wind and rough tides to those parts of the US! That could point to a pretty active hurricane season for 2020.

For BCR, hurricanes passing through are the most frequent the natural disasters that bring with them strong winds and flooding. Thankfully, the two tropical depressions so far in 2020 didn't go right over BCR but they did bring some rain. Hurricane season goes through the end of November though, and whatever it brings, BCR is a prepped and ready.

Hurricanes aren't the only disasters that can happen. Whether it's a hurricane, a tornado, fires, ice storms, flooding, drought, blizzards, or whatever nature brings, preparing your pets for those events is critical. Just like BCR does, all pet owners should be ready in case of an emergency and have a plan for keeping pets safe.

First, always be aware of the weather in your area. Weather folks on the news can go a little crazy when reporting on a big storm or event, but at the heart of what they're saying is that something is coming. Stay on top of the reports so you know. If you live in a hurricane-prone area or one that experiences snow and ice in winter, you'll have time to put your plan into motion. Tornadoes and severe pop-up storms don't give much warning.

When you get the word that weather is happening, put your plan into motion.

Every pet owner should have these things ready to go:

- *Enough food and water for five days for each pet you have. Don't forget bowls and a can opener if you feed your pets canned food. Experts also suggest that you have extra water to wash your pet with if its been in polluted flood waters.
 - *Your cat's litter box, extra litter, a scoop and garbage bags.
- *Cat carriers and harnesses or leashes. Also make sure your cat is wearing a collar with your correct contact information on it. Carriers and cages need to have enough room for your cat to stand up and move around in case it has to be in one for a long time. Putting your pet's favorite blanket or towel in the carrier and maybe even a favorite toy will help your cat feel safer
- *Recent photos of you with your cat and detailed descriptions of them in case you get separated. This will help prove that your cat is yours when you're reunited.
- *Make sure your pet is microchipped and the company has your current address and phone number on file. Even in nonemergency situations, all pets should wear collars with ID tags as well as being microchipped. Pets' microchips can be registered free at Found.org!
- *A written record of your cat's medical conditions, behavior issues and a feeding schedule with the name and number of your veterinarian. This will help if you're forced to leave your cat with a temporary foster.

Other things that are helpful to have on hand include newspapers, paper towels, trash bags, household bleach and your cat's brush and maybe nail clippers.

Pet owners can also take a few tips from how shelters and rescues prepare for big weather events. The shelter emergency list includes some things pet owners would find helpful, like:

- *Flashligh
- *Heavy gloves that can help keep you safe if you have to pick up a panicked animal.
- *Tarp
- *A radio



Whatever you do, don't abandon your cat to fend for itself even if you think your house is secure. BCR's Gabriel (left) (who crossed the Rainbow Bridge in March 2019) managed to survive all alone through Hurricane Irma in 2017 underneath a car in Miami. He was the rare exception and it's a miracle he did survive. He arrived at BCR very emaciated and covered with wounds, either from flying debris or from other animals. As covered extensively on the news, there were many other heartbreaking cases of pet abandonment in Florida and Texas during and after recent hurricane disasters. The truth is that it's very likely your pet won't survive on its own.

How did you find out about BCR?

It was back in 2017. I found out about BCR from my friend, Mel Lozano, who runs a TNR non-profit for feral cats in Riverside, CA. He mentioned BCR to me and I was intrigued and tuned in for a night tour in late September. Well, you can say that I was "hooked!" The tour was so fun and funny and really brought out all the individual cats' personalities. It was amazing to see blind cats running, jumping, and playing just like any other cat. It was then that I learned Alana's philosophy "Blind cats don't know theyre blind, they just know they are cats." Also, it was touching to me that BCR provides a forever home to cats with FIV and FELV. From them on, I was devoted to the cats and the mission of BCR.

Have you visited , and if so, what did you enjoy most? What surprised you the most?

I have visited BCR twice, both times in 2019. The first time, I stayed at the motel in St. Paul's and came when BCR opens to the public in the mornings. It was just a THRILL to finally meet the cats that I had followed online for so long! People have sometimes said that it is like meeting a celebrity and that is so true. I think what I enjoyed most was coming in to any room in the two houses and just being "mobbed" by the cats! One time, I just had to just lay flat and pet each one. It is overwhelming but in the best sense of that term. The next time I stayed in the guest house and got up each morning and helped to clean the rooms. Now that is an amazing experience as you get more time with the cats and they really do kind of guide you in your work. It is hard work but it goes by quickly as you just love being in the presence of the cats.

What surprised me most was seeing the schedule of feedings and medication and spot cleaning in the rooms during the day. The staff have everything down and all runs like clockwork but also with a sense of fun.







The first BCR cat I sponsored was Miss Emily in House 1, Room 4 - The Crazy Kitty Room. At first, I sponsored Emily because she was one cat who didn't seem to have as many sponsors as some of the others but I was soon drawn to her extremely playful personality and sense of silliness and especially interacting with her when I came to visit. The next cat I sponsored was Jack. He was an FELV+ kitty and I fell in love with him immediately when I saw him on tour. Jack came from an abuse situation and he was so timid at first, but the staff worked with him for a long time until he found his feet and felt comfortable. My enduring image of Sweet Jack is of Melinda coming into his room for tour and Jack immediately jumping down from the kurandas and running to her for love. Sadly, Jack succumbed to FIP in June 2018 and it took me awhile to get over that and choose another.

One of the cats that had most endeared himself to me by his personality was <u>Scotty</u> and I knew that he had to be my new sponsor cat. He is larger than life (and not just his waist)! He is known to be a Romeo and presently has six "wives" in room 3 that he snuggles with.

He is also known to get "hangry" when his kibble bowl is nearing empty and he ends up in timeout (which was caught on Facebook once!!) I'm very proud to be a sponsor to cats who otherwise would have been euthanized if not for the haven BCR gives them

If you could tell people one thing about BCR one thing about BCR, what would it be?

I would tell them to visit and, if possible, to volunteer!!! By doing that, you get to see the cats up close and to see the wonderful work that the staff does and to also meet with other people to have been drawn to BCR and the cats just as much as you have. The BCR Family. What's not to love?


