Achoooo! Have Pet Allergies?



Is your beloved pet starting to make you sneeze? Have runny eyes? You could be getting allergic to your cat or dog. Allergies can be present when people are born or develop at any time through life. They can be particularly dangerous for people who suffer from asthma. Until recently, becoming allergic to your pet left few options except giving them away, which no one wants to do. Every case of allergies is different so how to handle it is an individual decision.

An allergic reaction to a cat is triggered by a specific protein (Fel d 1) secreted by cats from glands all over their bodies throughout their fur and also present in their urine and saliva. The situation is similar with dogs. In cats, Fel d 1 moves through their fur

every time they groom and results in dander that then moves into the air. It can stay airborne for hours and also settle on soft surfaces like beds and couches. Animals produce different amounts of dander and it increases with age, which could explain why some people have pets for years before ever developing allergies.

Cats may be more allergy-inducing because they are more often inside pets, have access to the whole house and bathe themselves, versus owners bathing them as happens frequently with dogs. On top of that, cats groom a lot every day, creating more opportunities to spread the saliva on their fur and release dander into the air.

There are lots of ways to combat pet allergies, from over-the-counter antihistamines to allergy shots (called immuno-therapy or desensitization therapy). Along with those options, Yerwellhealth.com recommends avoidance and consistent cleaning as steps for keeping your pet if you have allergies. Excerpted from their list are suggestions that you:

- Ensure the pet is neutered (particularly for dogs and cats). Neutering male dogs and cats reduces their allergen production.
- Bathe the pet at least once or twice a week. A word of caution is in order with this recommendation. Some
 pets, especially cats, carry a strong dislike to baths, and caution is needed to avoid bites and scratches.
- Wipe down the pet using a wet cloth daily.
- Remove the pet from the bedroom; close the bedroom door and air vents leading to the bedroom
- Keep the pet outside, in the garage, or in a part of the home with an uncarpeted floor. This can depend on the climate in your area, and it's important to consider whether this is fair to your pet as well.
- Vacuum frequently with a HEPA-equipped vacuum cleaner.
- Purchase a HEPA room air cleaner for use in the bedroom and/or other parts of the home (it is best to keep the HEPA filter off of the floor so as to not stir up more dust).

For cleaning, Verywellhealth.com also recommends that you:

- Steam clean all carpets and upholstered furniture.
- Launder or dry clean all bedding and curtains.
- Vacuum all hard floors.
- Wipe down all hard surfaces and furniture.
- Replace any air conditioner and heater vent filters.
- Consider having your vents cleaned (at the same time make sure to have your dryer vent cleaned. This has
 nothing to do with pets but is a significant cause of home fires, and dryer vents tend to collect more lint when
 there is an animal in the home).

In addition to the above medical options, there are natural methods for treating allergies, too.

MotherEarthNews.com has a super list of ideas, from neti pots that clear sinuses to tinctures made from specific herbs and allergy-fighting foods.

There's also something brand new to add to the list of medicinal and practical steps you can take. Pet food company Purina has just begun selling Pro Plan LiveClear, a food specially created to reduce allergens. According to Purina:

"The key ingredient in *Pro Plan* LiveClear is a specific protein sourced from eggs. When cats eat LiveClear, the protein binds to the Fel d 1 and safely neutralizes it in the cat's mouth. By reducing active Fel d 1 in the cat's saliva, it reduces the allergen that is transferred to the cat's hair and dander when they groom, ultimately reducing the allergen in the environment without impacting the physiology of the cat."

Developing an allergy to your pet doesn't have to mean saying goodbye to your furry friend. There are lots of things to try before that final and awful step. Having a plan and keeping it going is the answer!

Sometimes, despite all our efforts to keep them healthy, they cross the Rainbow Bridge.


This is especially true of our leukemia-positive cats.
