What Does Heat Stroke in a Cat Look Like? Will you know it when you see it?

Cats are good at hiding things when they don't feel well, but happily heat stroke isn't one of them. That's good because if you see signs of it in your cat you need to take fast action.

It's still summer and hot so heat stroke is something to be on the lookout for. We've talked before about how to <u>keep a cat hydrated</u> and <u>cool in the summer</u>, but it's also a good idea to know specific signs of heat stroke.



According to superpetcare.com, signs of heat stroke can include:

Panting

Red tongue

Drooling

Sweating from their feet

Agitation and disorientation

Vomiting

High temperature

Many of these are very visible signs and if you see them in your cat, get to the vet right away since they can lead to other serious health problems if left alone.

The <u>superpetcare.com article</u> includes a couple of other suggestions for keeping cats cool in addition to keeping them hydrated and making sure they have shady spots outside. Houses can get pretty warm inside, too, so there are some great ideas for keeping indoor cats cool. One is to close the curtains in the areas of the house where your cat spends most of his time. Doing this will keep the sun out and the air cooler.

As we know from the BCR cats (like Hermes, Sadie, Precious and Gallie) stretching out on the cool catio concrete or inside floors feels VERY good on a hot day. In the home, because they are frequently tiled and/or have cool feature surfaces, bathrooms are excellent places for cats to cool off. Another great tip is to line a

cat bed with a damp towel and turn a fan on it to create a cool breeze.

If you regularly play with your cat for exercise, take it easy when it's hot out so they don't overdo it. Some cats will play until they are panting and exhausted on any day! If your cat does get exercise this way, be sure to do it in a cool place in the morning or evening, before the heat of the day sets in.

How did you first learn about BCR?

So around that time I was doing some searches on tips regarding living with disabled pets (not that he needed anything special, he ruled on three legs!) and came across BCR. I was amazed at the stories I was reading and the work that you being done there and wanted to support.


