#### Full-Mouth Tooth Extractions – When and Why

Cats can develop problems with their mouths and teeth over the course of their lives. Typically mouth problems are related to gingivitis – just like people – and veterinarians will treat them with regular teeth cleanings and a tooth extraction if it's warranted. Some cats may experience more severe mouth problems in the form of stomatitis, which is caused when a cat's autoimmune system overreacts to plaque on its teeth, causing swelling, ulcers and extreme pain.

Imagine having canker sores in your mouth all the time. That's what a cat experiences with severe gingivitis or stomatitis – constant pain, which will impact almost every aspect of a his life.

Cats are good at hiding pain but when they have stomatitis, an owner might see a range of symptoms, like losing interest in eating, weight loss, bad breath, drooling and pawing at his mouth. If stomatitis has advanced to the point where your cat has ulcers in his mouth already, you may see blood in his drool.

These symptoms may impact lots of different areas of your cat's health so if any are happening, an immediate vet visit is in order.

Because they aren't exactly sure what causes stomatitis, vets usually rely on treatments to reduce swelling and pain management. For severe cases, the most effective way to treat this condition is to remove the trigger, which is plaque on a cat's teeth. The best way to do that is to remove all a cat's teeth, called a full-mouth extraction. That sounds like a scary and painful prospect but when it's done the cat is no longer in pain, there will be no more plaque present in his mouth to bring on stomatitis.

It's important to note that full-mouth extraction is not always a 100% cure for stomatitis. It is possible that occasionally a cat will still continue having problems after having it done.

The big question for most pet owners is "How will my cat eat with no teeth?" The good news is that they'll do fine. Many people report that their cats are happily able to eat kibbles as well as canned food when they have healed. They just don't chew the way they used to.





Seven and Voldo had full-mouth extractions

Several BCR cats have had full-mouth extractions for stomatitis and dental problems and they are doing GREAT! Visit our 24-hour cameras and watch Journey, Poppy and Seven in action. They eat, sleep and play very happily and, most importantly, they are pain free. Voldo had this procedure last week to help his his very painful stomatitis.

So, while it sounds really dire and scary, if your cat needs a full-mouth extraction, it's because he's already in a lot of pain and the process will take that away and give him back his happy life. Most vets these days are able to do dental procedures and extractions in their offices. If they aren't, they'll recommend a dental specialist. Take care of your cat post-operatively with their instructions and soon your happy and content cat will be back with you and pain free!

#### How did you first learn about BCR?

I always look on the book tables at BJ's and one day saw "Homer's Odyssey" and bought it. I loved the blind Homer's antics! I noticed the reference to Blind Cat Rescue in the back and was so excited because it was in NC, only 100 miles from Raleigh where I live! I visited and loved it...in fact, I was so emotionally moved that these cats were safe and loved in a lifetime sanctuary, I cried all the way home after my first visit! That was eight years ago. I usually visited every Open House (before COVID) and brought my brownies! Sometimes, I will visit between Open House events and still bring brownies.

#### Have you visited and, if so, what did you enjoy most? What surprised you most?

Yes, I visit often and enjoy loving on the kitties! They are so well socialized and climb over each other to get into your lap! There never seems to be enough time to visit! So much Cat Love -- I've had three cats in my lap and one (Chester or Mickey) on my shoulders! Surprises...there are so many! I'm always surprised there is never any "cat shelter odor"...you know what I mean! The smell of litter and pee (and poop)! I'm amazed how well cared for all the cats are! They get great high-quality food, have lots of enrichment in climbers, toys and outdoor catios with birds to watch and lizards and bugs to hunt. I'm also always surprised at the medications needed daily, multiple times a day! And the food...wow, three times a day all the bowls of wet food! 180 cases a month!


I send a monthly Chewy box with Weruva pouches and variety canned and Tiki Cat sea bass! I started sending the sea bass for Thurston when he was struggling with very high blood glucose levels! He loved the sea bass in broth (no gravy!) and helped bring his BGs down...his roommates also love the sea bass!

The cats are never denied or delayed any vet care or specialty vet care...ever! I felt that was one of the most important qualities of any cat sanctuary! I love that Alana will take cats that are "hospice" care so they will have wonderful comforts and care for the rest of their lives. When BCR promises the cats forever, they mean it! When a cat passes away, their ashes are put into a Memorial Garden on BCR

grounds, their forever home. Supporters send memorial stones for the gardens honoring the beloved cats.

For many months, when I would visit WiFi he was so shy. I'd sit and just talk to him. Then after many months, I was sitting in a chair talking to WiFi and suddenly he jumped up onto my lap and laid down! Everyone was shocked because I was the first person to have WiFi lay in their lap! What a wonderful surprise!







I love that some of the lobby cats can enjoy the backyard on their own. And watching Roo (the rooster) and the Guinea hens in the front yard is so cute! I remember Butterball (also known as ET – Evil Turkey) that used to chase Alana and Roo is so tiny but he knows he rules the roost!



#### What cat or cats do you sponsor? Why did you choose them?






