Feline Infectious Peritonitis

In keeping with the theme of "Pets and Coronavirus" that appeared in a previous newsletter, this article will focus on feline coronaviruses concentrating on the virus that causes feline infectious peritonitis (FIP). To recap briefly, coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that can cause disease in both humans and animals. There are 2 types of naturally occurring feline coronaviruses; feline enteric coronavirus (FECV) and feline infectious peritonitis virus (FIPV); the latter causing FIP, which currently is an incurable, lethal disease. Of note, no known transmission of FECV from domestic cats to humans has been observed.



comprehensive website is chalk full of detailed and valuable information on FIP that is maintained and updated by Dr. Niels Pederson, who is the premier expert on all things FIP. Dr. Pederson has a very interesting background and illustrious career filled with many accolades and awards that you can actually read about on the website (see Autobiography under the Dr. Pederson tab). The striking point regarding Dr. Pederson is that he coauthored his first research paper on FIP that was

published in 1964. At that time, not only was there a lack of knowledge about FIP, but there was very little published about cats in general. He has researched many infectious diseases of cats, including feline leukemia virus (FeLV) and feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV); however, FIP continues to be his "first love." Although officially retired as a distinguished professor emeritus in October 2013 from the University of California at Davis, Dr. Pederson remains an active emeritus faculty and continues his FIP research which "still consumes" him today. He considers FIP to be a "worthy adversary" as it remains one of the most complex and challenging infectious diseases of any species that he is compelled to see prevented and cured.

How did you first learn about BCR?

I first learned about BCR after reading the book, "Homer's Odyssey," in 2010. I saw that Gwen Cooper mentioned BCR in the acknowledgements. I have always had a heart to adopt the "underdogs" and the hard to adopt cats. After reading the book, I KNEW I eventually wanted to adopt a blind cat, especially since they are more at risk to be put down in a shelter from overcrowding than a sighted cat. I went on the BCR website, and was looking for a cat to possibly adopt. When I found out that all the cats have a forever home when they arrive at BCR, I was touched. Even though I planned to continue my search, I wanted to follow BCR's journey, and figure out how I could help.

Have you visited and, if so, what did you enjoy most? What surprised you most?

I finally got the opportunity to visit BCR in 2018. My wife loves "special needs" cats as well, and we made it a point to visit when we went on our first time. We also visited in 2019, and were going to visit this year, if it wasn't for the COVID-19 pandemic. What I enjoyed the most was visiting ALL of the cats – blind, FIV and FELV. It is hard to choose what really surprised me. I guess what surprised me the most was how clean ALL of the buildings and rooms were. I knew that the cats would be well cared for, but I have never been to a shelter or sanctuary THAT clean!



What cat or cats do you sponsor? Why did you choose them?

I sponsor Mickey, Uncle Fester and Skipper. I was sponsoring Mickey and Boone, but when Boone passed away this year, I adopted Fester and Skipper in his honor since they were Boone's "best friends." My wife and I chose Boone, because of his gentle nature, and he reminded us so much of one of our cats that passed away (who was disabled). I originally was going to sponsor Snicker, but when I met Mickey, I chose him instead. He reminds me of a blind "Ed White," who is the White cat in the Henri Le Chat Noir videos. I LOVE his personality, and he is too adorable for words. For the past few years, I try to sponsor two cats when I am able to.

If you could tell people one thing about BCR, what would it be?

If you are looking for an organization to support where the animals are truly cared for and loved, this is the place to support. 
